Special Summary of the 11 years of dictatorship under Hugo Chavez's regime as a response to his speech in Denmark. Parte II

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6.- "I have witnessed very harsh scenes of repression on the streets of Copenhagen. You don't see that in Venezuela, you don't see that in Cuba, you don't see that in Ecuador." Hugo Chavez Frias

People of Denmark and other friendly countries, to end this summary, we want to show you the most revealing images of what this regime does. The only way we have to show the world what happens in Venezuela is through the lense of a camera, until the day Chavez takes that away from us.

On the following images you will see how us, the Venezuelan citizens, not only have seen the abuse, the harassment and the violation of our rights through the lense of the few media channels we have left but each and every one of us who have participated in pacifist and non-violent marches (as a right we have under our Constitution) have also, in one way or another, lived all that personally.

Below, in chronological order, you will see images of events from 2002 on which clearly show the abuse by Hugo Chavez's regime. So every time you see a wounded person, a physically abused woman or a lifeless body, you can remember the words of that great hypocrite, the sick and shameless dictator Hugo Chavez when he had the nerve to say in Denmark: "I have witnessed very harsh scenes of repression on the streets of Copenhagen. You don't see that in Venezuela, you don't

see that in Cuba, you don't see that in Ecuador." You can be the judge:

First of all, an important clue: In January 2009, Chavez ordered to spray protesting students with "the good toxic gas."



These are the tear gas bombs to which Chavez referred to when he ordered his sorry followers to attack students and other demonstrators with "the good toxic gas"

According to statistics on "defense goods" exports presented by the Commerce State Secretary to the Spain's Congress Defense Commission: <u>Venezuela purchased 155.942</u> Euros in police material in 2008, 111.450 Euros of which were destined to the acquisition of tear gas. (And since that is not enough, China also sells "the good toxic gas" to Venezuela.)

As written by Rocio San Miguel in her article "The Good Gas from Spain" in 2009: Spain cannot continue to sell tear gas to Venezuela to be used for the violation of human rights in the hands of the government officials against peaceful demonstrators who oppose the government politics. Spain cannot continue to profit from the sell of "the good gas" used for Venezuela's internal repression. And it cannot for two reasons: a) Because the Defense Material Foreign Trade Laws approved by Spain's Parliament in 2007 prohibits the sells of weapons to countries in which there is a real risk for these weapons to contribute to the violation of human rights, to the perpetuation of the armed conflicts and the deterioration of its sustainable development. b) Because Spain breaks the European Union's Code of Conduct for the effective control of weapons trade." This is a human rights violation of Venezuelans and a pitched and unbalanced battle between State and unarmed Venezuelans.

Rocio San Miguel's article continues: "In Venezuela protests are criminalized. 2,200 people have been prosecuted in 9 years for protesting, according to recent PROVEA documentation (PROVEA: Venezuelan Program in Education-Action in Human Rights, a non-governmental organization.) This means a 244 prosecuted people per year. In other words, every 36 hours a new judicial process is started against a person who protests in Venezuela, most of the time, people who have been attacked with the tear gas used by the government officials.

More that a civil and political rights violation, this is a war between State and its citizens. It is an intimidation tactic developed in a generalized and systematic way against those who are seen as opponents of the government in a clear and very well designed tactic of national segregation."

Let us start with the summary of the shameful acts of 2002, in the hands of Chavez's regime so we don't go too far back.

April 11, 2002: Llaguno overpass bridge. Violent assassination of civilians during a pacifist march. Armed paramilitary groups who are supporters of the Chavez's regime, along with officials of the National Armed Forces massacred innocent demonstrators on this date. 19 deaths and hundreds of severely wounded civilians were the result of confrontations between armed chavistas and innocent unarmed civilians carrying flags and banners.

September 20, 2002: with tear gas and pellets the National Guard violently dispersed a vigil organized by the civil community around the offices of PDVSA (Venezuelan Oil Company) in Chuao, which resulted in 3 wounded people among them a camera man from the Miranda State Governor's Office and many victims of tear gas intoxication. After being restrained by more than 85 officials from the National Guard, the participants from Fuerza Solidaria continued to Plaza Altamira to carry out the vigil.

October 10, 2002: more than a million people marched in Caracas demanding Chavez's resignation. A group of chavistas ambushed the stream of cars that were traveling to the city for the "Toma de Caracas" ("Regaining Caracas"), blocking both accesses of the La Cabrera tunnel. Sheltered by the darkness of the night, the chavistas attacked the participants by shooting and throwing stones at them leaving 6 wounded. The attack started at 4am under the noses of the traitorous National Guard of the 29 Station located on the side of one of the tunnel's access.



Marizta and hundreds of other brave Venezuelan women confronted the tyrant and his gorillas, ready to give up their lives for freedom and democracy."


January 3, 2003: barricades, bombs and armored cars from the police, National Guard and chavistas paramilitary resulted in 2 deaths and several wounded during ambush to an opposition march at Los Proceres.

January 21, 2003: One person murdered identified as Carlos Garcia Arrieta, 28 years old, and 25 civilians wounded by bullets, pellets and other blunt objects is the result of the confrontations between chavistas and the opposition at Los Valles del Tuy, Miranda State.

INSTIGATION TO COMMIT A CRIME, GANGING AND DESTRUCTION IN RELATION TO HIS PARTICIPATION AT THE NATIONAL SHUTDOWN THAT STARTED ON DECEMBER 2. If this is not a dictatorship, someone please tell me what it is.

February 28, 2003: the District Attorney's Office appealed the house arrest for Carlos Fernandez.

March 1, 2003: the District Attorney's Office requested jail for Carlos Fernandez.

May 1, 2003: One death and 6 wounded at a Labor Day March organized by CTV (Venezuelan Workers Confederation) at the O'Leary Plaza in Caracas. Chavistas dressed as officials of the regime shot at the participants.



1 dead and 6 wounded

May 24, 2003: cross fire at a western area of Caracas, (Catiazo.) Venezuelan paramilitary and guerrilla named Tupamaros and Carapaicas entrenched in Catia tried to stop an opposition concentration resulting in 1 death and 22 wounded.

June 12, 2003: Once more Chavez threatens to fire managers at PDVSA who allow the reintegration of former employees who participated in the national shutdown between December 2002 and February 2003.

June 12, 2003: National march demanding resources for the proper functioning of universities. More than 20 wounded was the result of the disturbances registered at the Petarazo, event celebrated in Caracas when the opposition gathered around 6,000 people.

October 4, 2003: Battle in Semerucos. The National Guard with long guns and bombs as well as by using insults and offensive language toward the ladies, attacked the people living at Semerucos. The officials violently entered the homes of PDVSA employees leaving 6 people severely wounded and around 500 people affected by the tear gas. <u>The soldiers made fun of the crying mothers who begged then to let them bring out their children while they chased them around and threatened them with raping them.</u>

December 6, 2003: A year alter the Altamira massacre, chavistas came back to destroy the plaza. They destroyed religious images and X-mas ornaments, did graffiti on the walls, and physically attacked the Mayor of Caracas Leopoldo López.

During the following days, from the 28 of February through the beginning of March, areas of the entire country experienced shutdowns called "guarimbas".

March 1, 2004: unjustified attacks against innocent civilians by the National Guard and other chavistas organizations are an every day nightmare for Venezuelans. Those organizations which are supposed to protect the Venezuelan citizens are filled with sick, bloodthirsty and henchmen like Chavez and the Castros who's only job is to torture whoever they feel like it. These creatures are not human beings, they are beasts that Chavez's regime has at its disposal to abuse, harass, and torture whoever they want while he has the shameless guts to say during his hypocritical, worthless and evil speech: "I have witnessed very harsh scenes of repression on the streets of Copenhagen. You don't see that in Venezuela."

See for yourself... These photos give you an idea about what Venezuelans go through, so you can understand what the monster Chavez is capable of doing to a human being, well that we know of. Same as other bloodthirsty aberrations like the Castro brothers, Hitler or any of the dictators he admires for being as sick as he is.



This is a young man who was tortured by the National Guard in front of his wife when they were leaving a friends' house to go back home after a dinner party.



With no reason, they hit him with their fire arms, punched him and kicked him on the street, dragged him inside their official truck, continued to torture him inside the truck, and finally dumped him on a highway

The mother of the victim writes: "Two convoys of the National Guard with no less than 15 men each drove by the house of some friends of ours in Altamira, where my son and his wife had been having dinner, when they were getting in their car to go home, only two blocks from me. Without a reason or explanation they grabbed my son, hit him, punched him, kicked him and dragged him into the terror vehicle. Once there, they hit him with the butt and the cannon of their rifles all over his body, they hit him with their boots, their helmets, fists and everything else they found. My son never saw their faces because they were wearing anti-gas masks which gave them the idea to detonate tear gas bombs inside the convoy. My son wears eye glasses and they enjoyed taking them away from him and smashing them with their feet. They didn't stop laughing while they tortured him. When they got to the Cota Mil freeway, in the area of El Marques, these awful men threw him on the asphalt and gave him a farewell beating."



This is another example of the mistreatment Venezuelans suffer in the hands of the National Guard.

This is a young student who participated at a peaceful demonstration

The victim's aunt writes: "This photo shows the wounds on my nephew's back from when he was arrested by the National Guard for being in the area of La Floresta on Monday March 1st, protesting at around 1pm as it is his right. The wounds were the result of the beating with different objects and the detonation of a tear gas bomb at less than 3 feet from him. They also spread some kind of itching powder on his skin and made him kneel to sing "Chavez won't leave." They insulted him and hit him on the head with their helmets before they dragged him inside a truck to take him away next to other young men and an under age boy. After keeping them in El Paraíso, CORE 5 for many hours, at around 6:30pm they let them go."

March 30, 2004: Soldiers punished for not being chavistas. On this day, a fire inside a disciplinary room in Fuerte Mara, located in La Guajira, Zulia State, resulted in eight soldiers severely wounded: Ángel Pedreáñez (20), Alcides Martínez (20), Orlando Bustamante (20), César Cábar (23), Abraham Mena (19) y Eusebio Reyes Gálvez (19), Ángel Enrique Medina y Mauricio Pulgar Parra.

"The victims were taken to the Hospital Universitario of Maracaibo. Soldier Orlando Bustamante and Alcides Martinez arrived with 2° y 3° degree burns on more than 50% of their bodies, specially from the waist up. Bustamante presented 2° y 3° degree burns on his thorax, arms and face.

Angel Pedreáñez presented severe wounds and was taken to the Burn Victims Unit at the Coromoto Hospital. Pedreáñez presented superficial and deep burns like in the respiratory system: nostrils, larynx, throat, inside the mouth, lungs, and also on 72% of his body: head, thorax, hips and both legs. He had to be hooked to a mechanical ventilator.

Later the other seven soldiers were taken to medical centers in Caracas."

Hugo Chavez played down the incident stating that it had being "an accident and just a small fire inside a room." He also noted that the burns the soldiers had suffered were minor.

"Ángel Pedreáñez's father, Ender Pedreáñez, active fireman for 37 years at the Fire Department in Maracaibo, reported that "the National Armed Forces were hiding the truth" and that the soldiers "were punished for signing against Chavez." With a broken voice, a sad look and a photograph of his son in his hand, Elsa Mendoza de Pedreáñez recalled that she had spoken with her son. "He told me: 'Mom, buy me some shorts, some sneakers and a tank top to get out of here.' He said that there was a lieutenant who made his life miserable and wanted to kill him because he refused to deliver weapons and ammunition to the Colombian guerrilla."

"Some of the witnesses stated that not only the room but also the bodies of the soldiers exuded gunpowder smell. 'The gunpowder smell inside the cell was very strong. Maybe they were showered with gunpowder before they set them on fire. That is why there are no combustible remains inside the cell' noted the newspaper's source."

June 3 and 4, 2004: 1 death and several wounded due to the activation of the referendum reversal.

This was a miracle in the history of the Venezuelan demonstrations. Opposition took the streets to celebrate Jan. 23, 1958 and no incidents were reported.

February 11, 2006: Mayor of Chacao was kidnapped for two hours by "so called" students when attended a forum at the University of Carabobo. The antisocials carried fire arms and tear gas bombs which they detonated inside the room where the forum took place to terrorize the 300 people who attended the event. They brutally stroke some of the journalists and took away all the memory cards from their cameras. Lopez said: "Unfortunately, what we have here is a search for excuses to act violently. The kidnappers who were supposed to be students at that university did not release the hostages until they reached a still unknown negotiation agreement with the university.






